By taxi: estimated cost: €15 - €25; journey time: 20-30 min

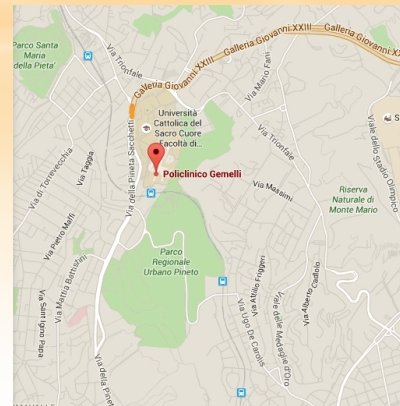
By train: take the METRO "LINE A" till "Valle Aurelia" station, here you can take the FL3 regional train to "Gemelli station"
